Adapted from our flagship publication in Brazil, the EURAXESS LAC list of funding opportunities highlights open calls to fund researchers mobility and cooperation with researchers based in Europe. The jobs, grants and fellowships announced are funded by the European Commission, EU member states or associated countries as well as private institutions and are open to researchers from Latin America and Caribbean States.

This list is published on a regular basis. This edition is valid for April.

To find more opportunities, we invite you to consult the **EURAXESS Portal**, and more specifically the:

- **EURAXESS Job database** that lists thousands of vacancies from more than 40 European countries and other regions in the world.
- And the <u>Funding database</u> allowing you to search for the funding programme you need for your mobility or research cooperation project.

Please note that **individual researchers** can upload their CVs on the portal, register their searches and create alerts to be informed when a vacancy matching their profile has been published. **Funding organisations** can publish their funding opportunities and scholarships on the EURAXESS website to increase their visibility and reach the best candidates worldwide.

1.1 <u>Horizon 2020 – Work programme 2018-2020</u> and calls targeting Latin America and Caribbean States

Horizon 2020 is the EU funding **programme** for research and innovation running from 2014 to 2020 with a €80 billion budget. H2020 supports scientifically-excellent research, innovation, and technological development, through **collaborative research projects** as well as **grants and fellowships to individuals**.

The final Work Programme for Horizon 2020 covers the budgetary years 2018, 2019 and 2020, representing an investment of around €30 billion.

The vast majority of this funding is allocated on the basis of **competitive calls** open to applications from researchers, businesses and other interested organisations located in any of the EU Member States or countries associated to Horizon 2020. It is also open to the world, so Latin American and Caribbean researchers and institutions are very welcome to get involved.

1.2 MSCA Co-Funding of regional, national and international programmes (COFUND): Call open

Aims to stimulate regional, national or international programmes to foster excellence in researchers' training, mobility and career development, spreading the best practices of Marie Sklodowska-Curie actions.

The COFUND call is open to European research (funding) institutions.

LAC organisations can be partner organisations in a proposal. COFUND supports many high-quality fellowships or doctoral programme positions, which include transnational mobility.

LAC researchers: Doctoral candidates can apply directly to COFUND positions advertised on the <u>EURAXESS job portal</u> throughout the year, while experienced researchers apply directly with the funding organisations.

Deadline: 27 September 2018.



The Marie Sklodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) contribute to excellent research, boosting jobs, growth and investment by equipping researchers with the new knowledge, skills and international and intersectoral exposure to fill the top positions of tomorrow and solve current and future societal challenges.

1.3 Marie Skłodowska-Curie Individual Fellowships (IF)

- call open

IF aims at supporting the international mobility of researchers within (**European Fellowships**) and beyond Europe (**Global Fellowships**) as well as helping to **attract the best foreign researchers** to work in the EU. The grant usually covers two years' salary, a mobility allowance, research costs and overheads for the host institution.

WHO? **experienced researchers of any nationality**, i.e. researchers holding a doctoral degree or at least four years' full-time research experience by the time of the call deadline.

Individual researchers submit proposals for funding in liaison with their planned host organisation from Europe. Proposals are judged on their research quality, the researcher's future career prospects, and the support offered by the host organisation.

Researchers based in LAC can apply for a European fellowship to perform a research stay of up to 2 years in Europe, choosing to apply either for a reintegration grant, a scientific grant or a society & enterprise grant in the non-academic sector.

Researchers based in Europe can apply for a global fellowship to carry out research in a third country such as any Latin American or Caribbean state and return to Europe. They can also apply to a European fellowship for mobility within the EU or associated countries.

Research institutions from LAC (all countries)_are eligible to host post-doctoral researchers coming from the European Union and Associated countries (EU/AC). In that case, note that you can express the interest of your institution to host a MSCA global fellow on EURAXESS Hosting tool here.

Deadline: 12 September 2018.

1.4 <u>ERC Advanced Grants</u>: Call expected on 17 May 2018

ERC Advanced Grants are long-term funding to pursue ground-breaking highrisk projects. They are designed to support excellent Principal Investigators at the career stage at which they are already established research leaders with a recognised track record of research achievements. This action is **open to researchers of any nationality** who intend to conduct their research activity in any European Member State or Associated Country.

The ERC's frontier research grants operate on a 'bottom-up' basis without predetermined priorities. The call applies to each of the three main research domains:

- Physical Sciences & Engineering
- Life Sciences
- Social Sciences & Humanities

Eligibility: any nationality, any age. Applicants must be leaders in their respective field(s) of research and must demonstrate significant achievement in the last 10 years

Location: research must be conducted in a public or private research organisation (known as a Host Institution/HI). It could be the HI where the

ERC grants support projects carried out by an individual researcher ('Principal Investigator') who can employ researchers of any nationality as team members. It is also possible to have one or more team members located in a non-European country.

Funding: up to € 2.5 million per grant (up to € 3.5 million in some cases)

Duration: up to 5 years

Sole evaluation criterion: scientific excellence of researcher and research proposal.

Deadline: **30 August 2018.** For more details on Advanced grants, see <u>ERC</u> website

Important notice: Time to spend on the project

Researchers applying for ERC-funding must be strongly committed to the project and spend a significant amount of time on it. However, it is not obligatory to spend 100% of your time in Europe whilst carrying out the ERC-funded research.

For Advanced Grants, the Principal Investigator should devote at least 30% of her/his working time to the ERC project and spend at least 50% of her/his total working time in a <u>EU Member State</u> or <u>Associated Country</u>.

1.5 EURAXESS Jobs

There are currently **around 10489 research job positions** (all over Europe, but also in other countries and in all disciplines) announced on the <u>EURAXESS</u> <u>Jobs database</u>. Opportunities can be viewed by country, level of seniority, field or research or via free text searches.

Please note that these jobs also include **doctoral positions**, including those funded by the Marie Sklodowska Curie Actions (MSCA – ITN & Cofund) and by the European Research Council (ERC).

2 EU Member States and Associated Countries

2.1 National EURAXESS Portals

The latest information on open calls for national grants and fellowships in the 40 member countries of the EURAXESS network can be accessed on the respective **national EURAXESS portals**:

2.2 AUSTRIA (Austrian Academy of Sciences - ÖAW)
 PhD Fellowship programme including outgoing mobility

The DOC Fellowship Programme of the Austrian Academy of Sciences offers funding for highly qualified doctoral candidates **from all nationalities and in all**

areas of research. The fellowships in the amount of 38 000 Euros allow young researchers to dedicate themselves to working in focused fashion to complete their doctoral thesis within a clear timeframe.

Applications for a DOC Fellowship are open to **doctoral candidates of all ages** who:

- completed their Diploma or Master's degrees no more than two years ago,
- are writing their thesis at an Austrian university, and
- submit a project exposé and a reference from their doctoral supervisor.

OUTGOING PHASE: It is possible to arrange a stay abroad of up to 12 months in length within the framework of a DOC Fellowship.

There is **no deadline for submission**, applications can be submitted at any time and take six months to process.

2.3 BELGIUM - Ph.D. Grant at Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB) (Incoming)

The department of Economic law, Centre of private law at Université Libre de Bruxelles offers a **full-time research grant for a 3 years period in order to write a Ph.D. thesis** (in English or French) on the general topic "Interactions between Intellectual Property Law (IP) and Artificial Intelligence (AI)".

The first year of funding is considered "seed money": it aims at giving the chosen candidate the possibility to further define his/her scientific project in order to obtain external funding beyond the initial 3 years period.

Duration: 1 year "seed money" grant (not renewable) followed by a 2 years grant (not renewable).

Eligibility

Applicants must hold a **Master Degree in Law** (120 Credits) or another degree deemed equivalent and fulfil the requirements of doctoral enrolment.

Deadline: 16 April 2018

2.4 FRANCE - PREFALC call for projects 2018 between France, Latin America, & the Caribbean

WHAT IS FUNDED:

PREFALC offers co-financing for 2-year projects of up to € 25 000 and up to 40% of the total budget of a project.

RESEARCH FIELDS:

Agronomic and ecological sciences, physical and chemical sciences; Humanities and social sciences, digital humanities; Medical sciences, human biology; Mathematical Sciences; Earth and universe sciences; Information and communication sciences; Engineering Sciences.

DURATION:

2 Years

ELIGIBILITY:

Eligible projects must include a French higher education institution (or a network of institutions) and at least two higher education institutions from different Latin American or Caribbean countries.

Deadline: 29 April 2018





PREFALC is a university cooperation scheme aimed at developing exchanges and training opportunities between French, Latin American and / Caribbean education institutions. It helps to support the mobility of lecturer-researchers for the realisation of seminars and training modules at master level. These modules must be clearly integrated into French, Latin American Caribbean masters degrees and allow European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) credits or a recognition of periods of study.

2.5 FRANCE (French Government) & institutional partners from ARGENTINA, COLOMBIA and MEXICO – ECOS call for projects

Based on partnership and transparency, the ECOS programme is designed to support projects of excellence in scientific collaboration. It funds exchanges between researchers in the form of **short-term assignments and specialisations for doctoral students** participating in the selected projects.

Collaborations on a joint scientific project with a Argentinian / Colombian / Mexican partner are currently being selected. Doctoral training has to be included in the collaboration.

To be admissible, the projects must involve a Argentinian / Colombian / Mexican PhD student.

Specificities depending on the Latin American partner country:

- Colombian projects may cover all fields of knowledge for a duration of 3 years. However projects that are part of the priorities of Franco-Colombian cooperation will be given special attention. The Colombian partner must submit his project simultaneously to the Colombian committee (on the same terms but in Spanish), using the form provided by COLCIENCIAS. To be admissible, the project must involve a Colombian PhD student.

Deadline for projects with Colombia: 4 May 2018

- **Mexican** projects (duration of **4 years**) may cover **all fields of knowledge.** However, it is suggested to check the priorities of Franco-Mexican cooperation in the call. The **Mexican** partner must submit his project simultaneously to the Mexican committee (on the same terms but in Spanish), using the form provided by ANUIES.

Deadline: 25 May 2018

- Projects in collaboration with Argentinian partners must include not only doctoral but also postdoctoral training. Three-year projects will be selected in the following areas:
 - 1. Sustainable development and population
 - 2. Water and atmosphere science and technology.

The **Argentinian** partner must submit his project simultaneously to MINCyT.

Deadline to submit projects with Argentinian partners: 15 June 2018.

Note that tripartite projects with other Spanish speaking American countries can be funded. Check the calls for more details. Project forms can be downloaded here.

2.6 FRANCE – PHD scholarship at University of Lille (Incoming)

Project title: Surface characterisation of catalysts for sustainable development using high-field (DNP)-NMR

A three-year PhD position in solid-state NMR spectroscopy of catalysts is available at the University of Lille, France. It can start from July 2018.

This project aims at developing and applying novel solid-state NMR methods to probe the local environment of quadrupolar nuclei at the surface of heterogeneous catalysts. The structural information obtained by solid-state

NMR will be useful to improve the performances of these heterogeneous catalysts.

Eligibility: National and **international students** who have graduated in **physics or chemistry**, preferably with a background in material sciences or NMR spectroscopy.

Deadline: 15 June 2018



GSO Leadership Academy is a joint project of German Scholars Organisation with Fraunhofer Helmholtz Society, Association of German Research Centres, Max Planck Society, and Klaus Tschira Foundation. Associated Partners are the Center for Science Management (ZWM), the Association of Technical Universities (TU9), and the German Association University Professors and Lecturers.

2.7 GERMANY - GSO Leadership Academy for Scientists and Researchers (Incoming)

Are you a young **German-speaking scientist or researcher** and are about to take the next step in your career? Are you interested in pursuing a career in Germany?

The programme is designed to give 25 full scholarships to **25 outstanding researchers of all disciplines and all nationalities** who are about to take the next step in their career – as a junior group leader in science or industry, as assistance or full professor, as founder of a start-up or as someone taking responsibility in a research-related organisation.

In two intensive five day training phases that blend self-assessment, interactive group workshops, case studies, videos, and lectures with individual mentoring and coaching, participants will be able to develop the skills they need for the next big step in their careers. They will gain a better understanding of their personal approach to leadership, experience what it means to model leadership in research-related environments, and learn how they can further push their personal development. As a group they will motivate and surprise each other and forge essential professional bonds with each other and with key players in their field.

2.8 ICELAND (The Icelandic Research Fund - IRF) - postdoctoral grants (Incoming)

The purpose of the **postdoctoral grant** is to help young research scientists to develop their academic careers. The applicant must explain how the fellowship fits with previous work of the applicant, how it will enhance his/her career development, and provide information about future research plans after the grant period. If the grant recipient accepts another position during the grant period, the grant payments will be terminated at the start date of the new position.

Research fields:

- Formal sciences
- Humanities
- Natural sciences
- Applied sciences
- Social sciences

Funding

The grant from the IRF may fund up to 100% of the total project cost. Approved expenses from the Icelandic research fund include: Salaries, operational expenses, travel expenses, contracted services, overhead expenses and facilities.

Duration: The maximum grant amount for projects is ISK 24 million for a 36-month project (approx. EUR 193 000), ISK 16 million for a 24 month project (approx. EUR 129 000), and ISK 8 million for a 12-month project (approx. EUR 64 000),

Eligibility: The eligible applicant must have obtained an invitation from a host institution, preferably different from the institution awarding the doctoral degree, prior to the submission deadline. Applicants for postdoctoral fellowships must have been awarded a doctoral degree within the past seven years before the grant application deadline.

Deadline: 15 June 2018

2.9 ITALY - <u>EURAC Federal Scholar In Residence</u> (Incoming)

The programme funds a **research stay of up to 3 weeks** at the Institute for Comparative Federalism of the European Academy of Bolzano/Bozen (EURAC); Aims at weaving experts and their networks in order to develop and advance comparative federal and regional studies.

This annual programme welcomes applications from scholars and practitioners in federalism, regionalism and intergovernmental relations.

Deadline of submission: 1 July 2018

2.10ITALY - <u>Fondazione IRCCS Istituto Nazionale dei Tumori: Inflow of foreign researchers</u> (Incoming, short term)

This international mobility programme is meant to be an essential tool for professional development throughout the stages of a researcher's career and aims at facilitating training, the acquisition and development of new skills, and a process of knowledge transfer in the fields of **experimental**, **translational and clinical research**.

Funding for **short-term visits (3-6 months) of foreign researchers** to Istituto Nazionale dei Tumori (INT)'s Units: a maximum monthly reimbursement of € 2500 is granted for travel and accommodation.

Deadline: Applications are accepted at any time.

2.11ITALY (Università di Pavia) - <u>CICOPS Scholarships</u> 2018 (Incoming, short-term)

WHAT? CICOPS scholarships are foreseen for research collaboration in the **short period** in order to encourage the mobility of researcher from developing countries.

10 scholarships will be awarded to visiting scholars for the year 2019 for a period of stay of 4 to 12 weeks at the University of Pavia.







Tech4Culture is an interdisciplinary and intersectoral doctoral programme funded by the H2020 MSCA-COFUND scheme and the banking foundation Compagnia di San Paolo.

WHO? Academics and other researchers from Developing Countries – including Latin American and Caribbean countries - who wish to carry out research in collaboration with a professor at the **University of Pavia** are welcome to apply.

Applicants must have the support of a collaborator at the University of Pavia who invites them with a formal invitation letter.

Applicants must have at least two years of either teaching experience or activity in international organisations and institutions. Applicants enrolled in a Doctoral or Postgraduate Course at an Italian University are not eligible to apply.

Deadline: 31 May 2018

2.12ITALY - University of Torino - Tech4Culture PhD programme (Incoming)

PhD Technology Driven Sciences: Technologies for Cultural Heritage (Tech4Culture) is a new **doctoral programme** in technologies applied to Cultural Heritage.

Tech4Culture PhD Programme aims at building up the next generation of Cultural Heritage professionals able to develop technological solutions and services for the restoration, the protection, the diagnostics and the valorisation of cultural heritage in academia and in non-academic fields.

The First Call for Applications will assign up to **10 fellowships** to incoming mobility early stage researchers. (A second Call will be published in March 2019.)

Duration: 3 years

Why apply? You will have the opportunity of developing your own PhD research project with a joint supervision (academic and non-academic), while receiving excellent scientific training, training in soft skills and increasing your expertise through national and international short-term visits and secondment opportunities.

Eligibility:


