
Declaration on commitment to the principles of the “European Charter for researchers” and the “Code of Conduct for Recruitment of Researchers”

February 2016 GEUS endorsed the recommendation of the European Commission of March 11, 2005 on the “European Charter for researchers” and the “Code of Conduct for Recruitment of Researchers”.

GEUS has now committed to review our Human Resources policies and work in detail with the issues of the Charter and Code.
