<u>"EURAXESS – Researchers in Motion"</u> is a European Commission initiative focused on **researcher mobility and career development.**

Among other activities, **EURAXESS supports individual researchers in finding jobs or funding o**pportunities to make their research stay in Europe a reality.

On the **EURAXESS Portal**, we encourage you to consult the:

- <u>EURAXESS Job database</u> that lists thousands of vacancies from more than 40 European countries and other regions of the world.
- And the <u>Funding database</u> allowing you to search for the funding programme you need for your mobility or research cooperation project.

Please note that **individual researchers from Brazil and other LAC** countries can upload their CVs on the portal, register their searches and create alerts to be informed when a vacancy matching their profile has been published.

Funding organisations, including from Brazil and other Latin American and Caribbean countries can publish their jobs, funding opportunities and scholarships on the portal to increase their visibility and reach the best candidates worldwide.

To help you identify these opportunities, EURAXESS LAC regularly publishes open calls to fund researchers' mobility and cooperation with European teams. A novelty as from this edition, the list now combines funding opportunities open to both Brazil and other LAC countries. This edition is valid for November.

The jobs, grants and fellowships announced are organised by funding organisations (including private ones). In section 1, you'll find calls funded by the European Commission, in section 2, calls launched by individual EU member states or associated countries, and in section 3, calls promoted by LAC institutions open to researchers from Latin America and the Caribbean. In section 4, you'll find all the calls that were listed in previous editions of this document and that are still open.

We remain at your disposal to discuss any queries you may have regarding your mobility projects.

ERC Advanced Grants (5 years research projects in Europe, all areas)

BRC Advanced Grants are long-term funding to pursue ground-breaking high-risk phylicists. They are designed to support excellent Principal Investigators at the careler stage at which they are already established research leaders with a relognised track record of research achievements. This action is open to re-earchers of any nationality who intend to conduct their research activity in any Europan Member State or Associated Country.

The ERC's frontier research grants operate on a 'bottom-up' basis without predetermine priorities.

Eligibility: any nationality, any age. Applicants must be leaders in their respective field(a) of research and must demonstrate significant achievement in the last 10 years

Funding: up to € 2.6 million per grant (up to € 3.5 million in some cases) Duration: up to 5 years

Sole evaluation criterion: scientific excellence of researcher and research proposa.

1.4 European University institute (EUI, Italy) - incoming fellowships in social sciences and humanities

1.4.1 Fernand Braudel Senior Fellowship

Fellowships last for up to ten months in one of the EUI's four Departments which in turn invite fellows to participate in departmental activities (seminars, workshops, colloquia, etc.).

Fellows are encouraged to make contact with researchers sharing their academic interests, may be involved in the teaching and thesis supervision tasks of EUI plofessors, and associated with one of the research projects being carried out at the EUI.

1.4.2 Max Weber Fellowships for junior post-docs

Max Weber fellowships are designed for junior post-docs who would like to pursue an academic career, concentrate on their own research and enhance their academic practice in a multidisciplinary environment. The Programme awards 1, 2, and exceptionally 3 year long fellowships in the fields of political and social sciences, economics, law and history.



Grants & Fellowships 1European Union



The European Union's Horizon 2020 Work Programme 2018-2020, including preliminary information on all calls to be launched until 2020 has now been published.

Horizon 2020 is the EU funding programme for research and innovation running from 2014 to 2020 with a €80 billion budget. H2020 supports scientifically-excellent research, innovation, and technological development, through collaborative and innovative research projects as well as grants and fellowships to individuals set out in the Horizon 2020 work programme. The vast majority of this funding is allocated on the basis of competitive calls open to applications from researchers, businesses and other interested organisations located in any of the EU Member States or countries associated to Horizon 2020.

It is open to the world, so **Brazilian and LAC researchers** and institutions are very welcome to get involved.

The final Work Programme for Horizon 2020 covers the budgetary years 2018, 2019 and 2020, representing an investment of around €30 billion.

Access all open calls on the <u>Horizon 2020 Participant Portal</u> by entering the Topic ID of the call in the search engine (top-right corner of page).

Organisations from **any sector and country, including LAC countries** can participate in H2020 projects.

Only organisations from the Bahamas, Barbados, Brazil, Mexico and Trinidad and Tobago are not eligible for direct funding by the European Commission, unless clearly stated. It is suggested that Brazilian and Mexican organisations check their local co-funding schemes to support their participation (here for Brazil, and here for Mexico).

Please, note that all Latin American and Caribbean individual researchers are eligible to funding by MSCA and ERC.

Participation of team members from LAC countries:

ERC grants support projects carried out by an individual researcher ('Principal Investigator') in the case of Starting Grants, or 2 to 4 individual researchers (under Synergy Grants) who can employ researchers of any nationality as team members. It is also possible to have one or more team members located in a non-European country. Vacancies for team members of an ERC project be published the EURAXESS Jobs portal.

1.2 ERC Consolidator Grants – call open

What are the ERC Consolidator Grants?

ERC Consolidator Grants are designed to support excellent Principal Investigators at the career stage at which they are consolidating their own independent research team. Up to €2.75 millions are available for projects of up to 5 years duration.

Who can apply?

Researchers of **any nationality with 7-12 years experience** since completion of PhD (Extensions are possible under certain circumstances — see the latest <u>ERC Work Programme</u>), a scientific track record showing great promise and an excellent research proposal.

How much?

Consolidator Grants may be awarded up to € 2 million for a period of 5 years. (pro rata for projects of shorter duration). However, an additional € 0.75 million can be made available to cover eligible "start-up" costs for researchers moving from a third country to the EU or an associated country and/or the purchase of major equipment and/or access to large facilities.

An ERC grant can cover up to 100% of the total eligible direct costs of the research plus a contribution of 25% of the total eligible costs towards indirect costs.

Location

Research must be conducted in a public or private research organisation (known as a Host Institution/HI). It could be the HI where the applicant already works, or any other HI located in one of the EU Member States (see also eligibility of UK legal entities) or associated countries.

Important information on the call is included in the ERC Work Programme 2019 and especially in the <u>call-specific Information for Applicants</u>. The mandatory templates are available from the Participant Portal.

Deadline: 7 February 2019

About the **ERC**:

Set up in 2007 by the EU, the <u>European Research Council</u> is the first pan-European funding organisation for frontier research. It aims to stimulate scientific excellence in Europe by encouraging competition for funding between the very best, creative researchers of any nationality and age. The ERC also strives to attract top researchers from anywhere in the world to come to Europe. It funds young, early-career top researchers (<u>'ERC Starting grants'</u>), already independent excellent scientists (<u>'ERC Consolidator Grants'</u>), and senior research leaders (<u>'ERC Advanced Grants'</u>).

Please, note that ERC grants support projects carried out by an individual researcher ('Principal Investigator') who can **employ researchers of any nationality as team members**. It is also possible to have one or more team members located in a non-European country.

Vacancies for team members interested in joining an ERC led research project, can be published on the Euraxess-Jobs portal.



1.3 ERC Proof of Concept Grant 2019

Additional ERC funding scheme for researchers of **all nationalities** who already got an ERC grant (Starting, Consolidator, Advanced or Synergy) which is either ongoing or where the project has ended less than 12 months before the publication date of an ERC Proof of Concept call. The grants are worth up to €150,000 for a duration of up to 18 months. More information <u>here</u>.

1.4 <u>Marie Sklodowska-Curie Actions – Open call to</u> select Innovative training networks (ITN)

Innovative Training Networks (ITN) is the main European doctoral training programme, putting a special emphasis on non-academic sector participation and the innovation dimension. Innovative training networks bring together complementary institutions from different countries worldwide to train a new generation of researchers.

It is funded under the <u>Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions</u>/ <u>Horizon2020 European Union funding programme</u>.

The call will be open to consortia of organisations such as universities, research centres or companies, that propose a research training network, including Brazilian & Latin American institutions. There are three types of Innovative Training Networks:

1. European Training Networks (ETN)

Joint research training, implemented by at least three partners from in and outside academia. The aim is for the researcher to experience different sectors and develop their transferable skills by working on joint research projects.

The organisations should be established in at least three different <u>EU or associated countries</u>. Additional participants from any organisation anywhere in the world, **including Brazil & LAC** can also join a network.

2. European Industrial Doctorates (EID)

Joint doctoral training delivered by at least one academic partner entitled to award doctoral degrees, and at least one partner from outside academia, primarily enterprise. Each participating researcher is enrolled in a doctoral programme and is jointly supervised by supervisors from the academic and non-academic sector, where they spend at least 50% of their time.

The aim is for the doctoral candidates to develop skills inside and outside academia that respond to public and private sector needs.

The organisations should be established in at least two different <u>EU or associated countries</u>. A wider set of partner organisations from anywhere in the world may also complement the training.

3. European Joint Doctorates (EJD):

A minimum of three academic organisations form a network with the aim of delivering joint, double or multiple degrees. Joint supervision of the research fellow and a joint governance structure are mandatory. The aim is to promote international, intersectorial and multi/interdisciplinary collaboration in doctoral training in Europe.

The organisations should be from different <u>EU or associated countries</u>. The participation of additional organisations from anywhere in the world, including from the non-academic sector, is encouraged.


The maximum duration of an ITN project is four years. Calls are annual.

Please, note that the call is not open to individual researchers/students.

Brazilian & LAC researchers interested in high quality doctoral-level training in and outside academia can apply to the PhD positions created by these networks, including Industrial Doctorate and Joint Doctorate. They are advertised on the <u>Euraxess Job portal.</u>



1.5 Horizon 2020 - All Atlantic Ocean Research Alliance Flagship - Brazilian institutions funded

European Union call under H2020 will be investing € 33 million to fund research in the Atlantic. In addition to being the first step towards the implementation of the commitments made by the countries in the Declaration of Belém, the call meets the United Nations' Sustainable Development Objectives, especially item 14, "to conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and resources for sustainable development."

This is one of the flagship initiatives lauched in H2020 Wok programme 2018-2020.

Proposals shall include participants from South Africa and Brazil. Under this topic, legal entities established in Brazil are eligible for funding from the union.

Deadline: 23 January 2019



1.6 <u>Doctoral training programme in Functional Advanced Materials (DOC-FAM) – 2nd call for applications</u>

DOC-FAM is an excellence DOCtoral training programme in Functional Advanced Materials awarded to the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC), coordinated through the Institute of Materials Science of Barcelona (ICMAB) in collaboration with several partner research Institutions from the area, four of them contributing to the co-funding of the programme.

ICMAB welcomes applications from the best and brightest candidates with a degree in a field of science and engineering related to the ICMAB research activities, for a competitive and multidisciplinary training and research PhD programme. The diversity of our students and the interdisciplinary research fields related to Materials Science ensure an enriching working environment to develop your professional career.

1.7 <u>EuroTechPostdoc Programme – Call for</u> Applications (Incoming)

The <u>EuroTech Universities Alliance</u> invites highly talented experienced researchers to submit **interdisciplinary collaborative research project proposals** for one of the fellowships provided by the EuroTechPostdoc Programme.

The **EuroTechPostdoc Programme** is a postdoctoral fellowship programme for young experienced researchers who have already demonstrated excellence and potential in their field of research.

The four universities of the **EuroTech Universities Alliance** — Technical University of Denmark (DTU), Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL), Eindhoven University of Technology (TU/e) and Technical University of Munich (TUM) — will grant 80 fellowships divided over two calls for experienced researchers. Per call, each university grants 10 fellowships for a 24-month period to collaborative and interdisciplinary research projects across the Alliance.

Applicants may apply within one of the five focus research areas of the EuroTech Universities Alliance: Health & Bioengineering; Smart & Urban Mobility; Data Science & Engineering; High Performance Computing; Entrepreneurship & Innovation.

Applications for the second call will open 30 November 2018.

Deadline: 28 February 2019



Applicants from all countries are welcome, although IIASA gives priority to citizens or residents of NMO countries, including Brazil and Mexico

2.2 AUSTRIA - <u>Institute of Science and Technology</u> (IST) PhD programme (Incoming)

WHO? Open to highly qualified students from all disciplines of the **natural** sciences, mathematics, computer sciences and any related interdisciplinary areas.

Currently active fields of research include biology, neuroscience, physics, mathematics, data science & computation and computer science.

Applicants must hold a **Master's or Bachelor's** degree or anticipate the completion of the degree before September 2017. Participating students are expected to be proficient in written and oral English.

Deadline: 8 January 2019

2.3 AUSTRIA - <u>Young Scientists Summer Programme</u> at IIASA (Incoming)




