Named after Marie Skłodowska Curie, a Polish and naturalized-French physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity.

Innovative Training Networks


- Interdisciplinary & international doctoral training networks
- Multi- beneficiary Action: PhD programmes made up of partner organisations from different sectors such as universities, public and private research centres, companies, non-profit organisations etc.
- Dedicated to training early-stage researchers to become leaders in their field





COFUND

- Mono-beneficiary action to co-fund new or existing national, regional, institutional schemes for doctoral training and postdoctoral fellowships
- Individuals both early-stage and experienced researchers - are supported in their research training and career development through the co-funding.






What is unique about the MSCA?

- Applying for an MSCA PhD position is very much like applying for a job role.
- Projects have already been set by the Beneficiaries and Partner Organisations - all you have to do is apply to one that interests you.



Multidisciplinary training

- PhD candidates will establish a Career Development Plan (with supervisor) setting out research objectives, career objectives & training needs. Career plan includes planned publications and participation in conferences.
- PhD candidates will be engaged in a number of Networking activities:
 - Attending conferences and network meetings
 - Visiting participating organisations in order to exchange knowledge
 - Meeting with external experts to gain specialist input
 - Attending workshops
 - Collaborating with other projects or research groups


Eligibility – General Rule

- To be eligible for recruitment, you must at the date of recruitment be within the first four years (full-time equivalent research experience) of your research career and not have a doctoral degree.
- Nationality: No restrictions based on nationality

*Full-time equivalent research experience is measured from the date when you obtained the degree entitling you to embark on a doctorate (either in the country in which the degree was obtained, or in the country in which you are recruited), even if a doctorate was never started or envisaged.



Eligibility – Mobility Rule



You must not have resided or carried out your main activity (e.g. work, studies) in the country where you have been recruited "for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately before the recruitment date".

Question: Can I apply with an institution in the UK?

Yes

UK already eligible

As the first funding calls under Horizon Europe are launched, the new Q&A-style document confirms that UK applicants are already eligible to apply. The United Kingdom will therefore have the same rights and obligations, including financial, as other Horizon Europe associated countries.

What does the funding cover?

^{*} The funding is subject to a country correction coefficient adjusted for the cost of living in the country in which the researcher will work.

****The amount will change under projects funded by Horizon Europe.

^{**} In any ITN project, MSCA funding can support the researcher for a maximum period of 36 months. There is no exception to this rule, meaning that in those cases where the completion and submission of your doctoral thesis takes more than 36 months, you may need to look for additional financial support.

^{***} Note that the total amount received may vary from employer to employer, even within the same country. This is because employer as well as employee payroll taxes and social security costs can be deducted from the gross salary.



What does the funding cover?



- Participating organisations receive a fixed amount for each supported researcher as contribution to the researcher's remuneration and to the management of the programme.
- They must complement these contributions with their own sources (other than EU funding) to achieve the minimum living allowances to be paid to each researcher as established in the Work Programme.

^{*} In addition to the researcher unit cost, there will be an EU contribution for institutions based on unit costs, which amounts to EUR 325/person-month. These costs must be used towards the management of the programme.

**Other cost items (such as mobility allowance, family allowance, research, training and networking costs, travel, and indirect costs) may be funded through other resources, including other EU funds such as the European Structural and

indirect costs) may be funded through other resources, including other EU funds such as the European Structural and Investment Funds, but not through funding from the Horizon 2020.

***The amount will change under projects funded by Horizon Europe.



What documents do you need?







Types of documents to provide:

- Proof that you are qualified to undertake a PhD (relevant Masters Degree or equivalent qualification)
- A transcript of your grades
- A CV detailing prior experiences of projects, and any publications
- A personal statement detailing why you are suitable for the project
- Contact details for two or more individuals that can provide a reference/ letter of recommendation
- Certificate of language proficiency (if required)

^{*} Eligibility for the different projects might vary








