
EU-ASEAN RELATIONS

The European Union's relations with the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN): <u>Brunei Darussalam</u>, <u>Cambodia</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>, <u>Lao PDR</u>, <u>Malaysia</u>, <u>Myanmar (Burma)</u>, <u>Philippines</u>, <u>Singapore</u>, <u>Thailand</u>, and <u>Vietnam</u> date back to 1977 when official "Dialogue Relations" began. On June 2015, the EU confirmed the adoption of a new strategy "<u>The EU and ASEAN</u>: <u>a</u> <u>partnership with a strategic purpose</u>". In August 2017 during the <u>EU-ASEAN Post-Ministerial Conference</u>, the <u>second</u> <u>EU-ASEAN Plan of Action (2018-2022)</u> was agreed.



POLITICAL, SECURITY AND DEFENCE-RELATED COOPERATION



In July 2012, the EU <u>acceded to</u> ASEAN's **Treaty of Amity and Cooperation**. The EU and ASEAN work together to enhance crisis response and disaster management, including through EU support to the <u>ASEAN Centre for Humanitarian</u> <u>Assistance</u>. In October 2015 the <u>first EU-ASEAN Policy Dialogue on Human Rights</u> took place. A second edition of the Dialogue was held in Philippines, in November 2017. The EU organises with ASEAN High Level Dialogues on **Maritime Security**.

The EU has also co-chaired a number of initiatives in the **ASEAN Regional Forum** (ARF) framework, including **Meetings on Counter-Terrorism and Transnational Crime**, the **Defence** Officials Dialogue.

INTEGRATION, CONNECTIVITY AND SECTORAL COOPERATION



The EU is a **major development partner** of ASEAN and the **biggest donor** to the ASEAN Secretariat with some €200 million of **regional funding**. This comes in addition to bilateral cooperation, which will amount to over €2 billion in the period 2014-2020.



The new <u>Enhanced Regional EU-ASEAN Dialogue Instrument</u> programme (E-READI) with €20 million supports policy dialogues and experience sharing between the EU and ASEAN.



The EU supports with €85 million the ASEAN Economic Community <u>Blueprint 2025</u> in the areas of trade facilitation, standards conformance, customs and transport, civil aviation, intellectual property rights, statistics and integration monitoring.



The EU-ASEAN Migration and Border Management Programme started in 2015 (€3.4 million) supports the exchange of information between immigration officials in ASEAN capitals and the easing of visa requirements for ASEAN and non-ASEAN nationals within the region.



€60 million of EU funds over the period 2014-2020 will support initiatives and projects tackling **climate change and environmental issues**.

MOBILITY, EDUCATION AND CULTURE





The <u>EU Support to Higher Education in ASEAN Region</u> project (SHARE) is supporting the creation of an ASEAN Inter-University Network through **€10 million** in funding
