





Accommodation

If you are a non-EEA researcher, to comply with immigration authorities' requirements, you are recommended to book/arrange your first few nights' accommodation in advance of your arrival.

Temporary

Good quality accommodation is available throughout Ireland. Whether you are buying or renting you initial requirements might well be temporary while you search for more permanent accommodation.

Ireland has a range of [hotels](#), [bed and breakfast](#) and [hostels](#) that can accommodate all budgets. The suggested links provided above are neither exhaustive nor specifically recommended.

[Airbnb](#) is an online marketplace that enables people to list, find, then rent vacation homes for a processing fee. It has over 1,500,000 listings in 34,000 cities and 191 countries. This is widely used for people who are looking for temporary accommodation or vacation stay.

Renting

Renting is a common approach to accommodation in Ireland and there is a significant variety and supply of properties available to rent throughout the country. Flat/house sharing is also widespread, especially amongst students.

The [DAFT](#) and [MyHome](#) websites are the two primary national websites and provide a comprehensive list of properties available for rent and/or purchase.

Purchasing a home

Public health care for people coming to Ireland

If you are a national of the [European Economic Area \(EEA\)](#) or Switzerland, or if you are normally resident in Ireland, you are entitled to receive the same level of health care as Irish citizens. Depending on your income, you may be eligible for a [medical card](#), which entitles you to the full range of medical services at no cost.

If you are not from an EEA member state or Switzerland, you will be entitled to certain services free of charge and you will have to pay for the remainder.

If you are coming to live, work, study or retire in Ireland you can find out [more information on eligibility for public health services](#). If you are coming to Ireland on holiday or on a short stay (for example, on business), you can read [more information on health services for visitors to Ireland](#).

Social Welfare and Social Security

Social Security Number - PPS number

Your [Personal Public Service \(PPS\)](#) number is a unique reference number that helps you to access social welfare benefits and information from public service agencies in Ireland, such as the Department of Social and Family Affairs, the Revenue Commissioners and the Health Service Executive.

All employees in Ireland have a PPS number for tax purposes. Therefore, if you intend working in Ireland, you must apply for a PPS number. Applications are made through your local social welfare office. You can find the location of your nearest social welfare office consulting the [Department of Social Protection](#) website.

You will need to take the following documentation along with you when you make your application:

- Passport
- Garda Registration Card
- Proof of Address (gas/electricity bill in your name or bank statement)
- Letter of reference from your academic establishment or from your employee

If you are thinking of coming to Ireland to live, work, or study it is important to be aware of your [social security entitlements](#). 

Access to education for your family members in Ireland

- When applying to university in Ireland, you are automatically assessed and classified as either an EU applicant or International (non-EU) applicant: -Undergraduate EU applicants apply through CAO - International applicants and postgraduate applicants apply directly to university.
- It is important to distinguish between EU and non-EU fees - this scheme applies to non -EU fees and represents the only source of detailed info on the qualification criteria for non-EU people who what to study in Ireland.

Funding Offers

The Fulbright Awards provide grants for U.S. citizens to research, study, or lecture in Ireland.

The Fulbright Program is the largest of its kind in the United States, awarding more than 800 fellowships annually. Over 400 different types of opportunities are available to teach, research and conduct professional projects in more than 135 countries. Whether you are higher education faculty and administrators, or, professionals, artists, journalists, scientists, and independent scholars outside of the academy, the Fulbright U.S. Program has international opportunities to fit your needs and further your goals.

There are five types of Fulbright grants available to U.S. citizens

- **Fulbright U.S. Student Awards** for U.S. citizens to complete postgraduate research / study in Ireland over the course of 1 year
- **Fulbright U.S. Scholar Awards** for U.S. citizens to undertake research / lecturing in Ireland for a period of 2-12 months
- **Fulbright U.S. Specialist Awards** allow Irish institutions to bring U.S. citizens to Ireland for a period of 2-6 weeks
- **Fulbright Schuman Awards** for U.S. citizens to undertake study, research, or lecturing in the topics of the European Union, E.U. Policies, and E.U.-U.S. relations
- **Fulbright U.S. Inter Country Awards** allow institutions to bring a U.S. scholar currently in a European country, to Ireland for up to one week for lecturing or collaboration

The Ireland-United States [Fulbright] Commission for Educational Exchange, also provides non-Fulbright grants for Americans to travel to Ireland to study the Irish Language.

- **Gaeltacht Summer Awards** allow U.S. citizens who are Irish Language Learners & Teachers in the U.S., to spend 2-6 weeks studying Irish in the Gaeltacht.



Fast Track Work Permit for Non EU R&D (Hosting Agreement) Scheme

Find out more about the key immigration arrangements for foreign academics and researchers carrying out research in Ireland, with a particular focus on the Fast Track Work Permit for Non-EU R&D (Hosting Agreement) Scheme.

Overview

Non EU/EEA nationals require permission to work and study in Ireland. Additionally, some non EU/EEA nationals require an [entry visa](#) (permission to travel and enter the state of Ireland) to enter the country.

However, non-eu researchers applying for research positions in accredited research organisations can use a fast-track work permit scheme. This allows the host research organisation to employ the researcher without the need for a work permit.

Additionally, this scheme allows the researcher's immediate family to reside in Ireland for the duration of the agreement and work without any permission to work.

A preclearance policy has been introduced for the non-EEA de facto partners of Hosting Agreement holders. All de facto partners of Hosting Agreement holders will be required to seek permission to reside in Ireland prior to their arrival in the State. The new [procedure](#) will reduce processing times and provide clarity for these family members.

All universities, Institutes of technology (IoT) and a number of research-active organisations are accredited for the Fast Track Work Permit for Non EU R&D Personnel scheme. Details related to the accreditation procedure can be found [here](#).

EURAXESS Ireland processes Hosting Agreements on behalf of the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science. Over 5000 researchers across all disciplines have used the scheme since its introduction in 2007.






Who is coming to Ireland to get work in research

'I am a postdoc researcher in TU Dublin working on a commercialisation project of the thermophotovoltaic system for industrial waste heat recovery. Prior to joining TU Dublin, I worked in DCU as a postdoc researcher to investigate the role of heterogeneous energy storage in Paris-aligned scenarios for the Irish energy system.

While working in DCU, I came to know about EURAXESS, the organization that is greatly involved in looking after international researcher's welfare and provide legal advice on Irish immigration system. They regularly organise events and seminars to engage with foreign nationals who are currently working or wish to work in the Republic of Ireland. A friendly team in EURAXESS is always ready to assist with the university recruitment process and hosting agreements. EURAXESS also guides foreign researchers to go through different immigration steps if they want to stay long-term in the State. In my personal experience, I found EURAXESS a very helpful organisation who promptly assisted me to expedite the recruitment process in my present workplace.
