

#### **Openness**

- Horizon Europe 'by-default' open to almost all countries
- Non-discriminatory: researchers and innovators of any nationality can apply for grants (MSCA, ERC...)
- Association to the Programme:
  - 16 Countries associated to HE:
     Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Georgia, Iceland, Israel,
     Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukraine
  - In the "process of Association": Morocco, UK
  - Negotiations under way: New Zealand, Canada...

#### **Access to Horizon Europe funding**

- Automatically eligible for EU funding ("Beneficiaries")
  - Low- and Middle-Income Countries (see <u>list</u>)
  - Countries associated to Horizon Europe
- Non-associated third countries not eligible for EU funding ("Associated partners")
  - Exceptions on a case-by-case basis + specified in topic calls
- Co-funding mechanisms
  - E.g. Canada, Monaco, China, Switzerland... (<u>Guide CFM</u> on F&T Portal)





# International Cooperation in Horizon Europe Targeted international cooperation actions

## **EU-Africa cooperation** in Research & Innovation (R&I)

- As a strategic partner, the EU seeks to **enhance cooperation with Africa** to promote actions targeted to finding locally adapted solutions to global challenges, that often hit Africa hardest.
- The Comprehensive EU strategy with Africa and the Global Approach to Research & Innovation (R&I) are the EU's most recent policy initiatives that **prioritise R&I** as a key dimension of **sustainable development**.
  - The Comprehensive EU Strategy with Africa proposes to scale up the EU's academic and scientific cooperation with Africa, with a view to creating prosperous knowledge societies.
  - The EU Global Approach to R&I foresees special openness vis-à-vis African countries that wish to thrive as knowledgebased economies and accelerate their sustainable and inclusive development.
- The AU-EU High Level Policy Dialogue (HLPD) on Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) (est. 2010) is the policy forum where regular exchanges on R&I policy take place and where **long-term priorities** to strengthen cooperation are established. Under its aegis, the first ever AU-EU R&I Ministerial Meeting took place in July 2020, establishing the 4 joint priorities of the AU-EU cooperation in R&I:




#### The Joint AU-EU Innovation Agenda

For building stronger value chains for sustainable growth and decent jobs



- Flagship Initiative of the Global Gateway Africa Europe Investment Package.
- Outcome of the first ever AU-EU R&I Ministerial Meeting of July 2020, aims to enhance the impact of STI on socio-economic development, fostering the translation of R&I into products, services, businesses and jobs, in Africa and Europe.



We will strive to facilitate cultural exchanges and the movement of artists and artworks between our two continents, and encourage mutual undertaking for the restitution of cultural assets and promote access to and protection of cultural heritage.





Overview of Nigeria's participation in Horizon Europe thus far









#### Nigeria in the Framework Programme (thus far)










## Nigeria – Horizon Europe Thematic areas of projects' proposals






# Nigeria, Types of organisations funded in Horizon Europe thus far (Net EU contribution)






# Nigeria, Types of organisations funded in Horizon Europe thus far (Participations)






# Nigeria, Top Organisations funded in Horizon Europe thus far (Net EU contribution)







#### **Examples of successful EU-AU R&I Partnerships**



#### **Public** Health





- Main initiative AU-EU cooperation in global health research, tackling poverty-related infectious diseases in sub-Saharan Africa
- Joint investment of 1.4 BEUR, 417 projects funded until EDCTP2 + 1.6 BEUR for the ongoing Global Health EDCTP3 Joint Undertaking (0.8 BEUR from EU, 0.4 BEUR from the EDCTP Association and 0.4 BEUR from other contributing)
- 14 EU and 20 AU countries; 178 EU and 321 AU partners involved



#### Green **Transition**

- R&I Partnership on Food Nutrition Security and Sustainable Agriculture (FNSSA) channeled a joint investment of 710 MEUR for over 300 projects thus far, on four priorities:
  - Sustainable intensification
  - 2) Agriculture and food systems for nutrition
  - 3) Expansion and improvement of agricultural trade and markets
  - Cross-cutting topics
  - 27 EU and 47 AU countries, 875 EU and 557 AU partners involved
- R&I Partnership on Climate Change Sustainable Energy (CCSE), with an investment of 106 MEUR for climate services, renewable energy and energy efficiency which will support adaptation and mitigation efforts in various sectors for Africa and implementation of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change.
  - 11 projects funded thus far. 11 EU and 20 AU countries, 150 EU and 105 AU partners involved.
- nnovation & Technology
- ENRICH in Africa (EiA) Horizon 2020 project (2021-2023) developing a network of innovation incubators and accelerators: 10 from Africa and 10 from Europe.
  - Over 100 entrepreneurs supported thus far, exploring the needs of companies willing to expand into Africa or Europe.
  - Over 350 members of the EiA community: 227 companies (60% from Africa and 40% from Europe), 80 investors, 51 business support organisations, a EiA Centre opened in Cape Town, South Africa.

- Work Programme 23-24 prohibition provision in the General Annexes to the Work Programme
  - For legal entities established in Russia, Belarus, or in non-government controlled territories of Ukraine
  - Exceptions on case-by-case basis
  - Exempted are Marie Skłodowska-Curie fellowships
