Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions



- EU funding mechanism for excellent research and training activities which support the mobility of researchers between countries, sectors and disciplines to acquire new knowledge, skills and competences.
- Key source of European funding for research in Ireland across all disciplines.
- EU's flagship programme for doctoral education and postdoctoral training.
- Support researchers from all over the world with a focus on their training, skills and career development.









MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF)

Budget (2023): ~€260m (85% European Fellowships, 15% Global Fellowships)

Call deadline: 13 September 2023

Objective:


Enhance the creative and innovative potential of researchers holding a PhD, wishing to acquire new skills through advanced training, international, interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral mobility.

- ☐ Two types: European and Global Fellowships
- ☐ Mono-beneficiary: One researcher, one host organization
- ☐ Host organizations in **EU or HE Associated Countries**
- 8 scientific panels: CHE, ECO, ENG, ENV, LIF, MAT, PHY, SOC
- □ Developing skills for academia and beyond building bridges with non-academic organisations

Two Types of Fellowships


European (incoming) Fellowships

(12-24 months duration)



Global (outgoing) Fellowships

(12-24 months duration) + (12 months return phase)



+ Non-Academic Placement Max. 6 months

Secondments and Placements - Optional

- Optional <u>Secondment(s)</u> to any sector and any country worldwide up to 1/3 of the fellowship duration (or outgoing phase of GF)
 - EF: at any time during project
 - GF: Outgoing phase (not permitted in mandatory return phase)
 - Up to 3 months at European host allowed at start of project
- Optional <u>Placement</u>, for up to 6 months, in a non-academic European organisation at the end of the project (EF and GF)

Evaluated!

Must align with objectives, add significant value and impact and be described in proposal!

Eligibility Criteria: Researchers

Criteria	European Fellowships	Global Fellowships	
Nationality*	Any	Nationals or long-term residents of EU MS or HE AC	
Mobility	The researcher must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the beneficiary (for EF), or the country of the host organisation for the outgoing phase (for GF) for more than 12 months in the 36 months before the call deadline.		
Qualifications	Doctoral degree (or date of successful defence**) by call deadline		
Research Experience (FTE) (not calendar years)	Maximum 8 years research experience after PhD (with exceptions = career breaks, work outside research, research outside Europe for reintegrating researchers**, long-term sick leave, maternity/paternity leave, compulsory national service).

Resubmission	Researchers who received a score of <70% in the previous PF call cannot resubmit the same proposal with the same host ogranisation to the following year's call.		

^{*} Euratom: nationals or long-term residents of MS or Euratom AC

^{**} Successful defence: must be unconditional (no further requirements/corrections that need to be addressed)

Eligibility Examples

European Fellowship

- Irish researcher awarded a PhD in 2019 in the US, remains resident there. Applies for a European Fellowship in the field of nanotechnology together with a host institution in Ireland.
- **ELIGIBLE?** Awarded a PhD before the call deadline; less than 8 years research experience since award of PhD; has not resided in Ireland for more than 12 months in previous 3 years.

Global Fellowship

- Canadian researcher living in Ireland for previous 3 years, PhD in 2022, applies for a Global Fellowship in the field of psychology with a host in France, and outgoing phase in Japan.
- **ELIGIBLE?** Awarded a PhD before the call deadline; less than 8 years research experience since award of PhD; not more than 12 months in the Japan in previous 3 years...but do they meet the criteria for a "long-term resident" in EU/AC?





Postdoctoral Fellowships Funding

Prescriptive budgeting: based on unit costs!

- Researcher allowances are gross amounts and are subject to employer and employee statutory deductions
- Country correction coefficient applies to Living Allowance (e.g., IE = 119.5%)
 - ➤ EF = 1 coefficient (beneficiary country)
 - ➤ GF = 2 coefficients (beneficiary and Associated Partner country for outgoing phase)







How to Apply: Application Submission


- Single-stage application through the EC Funding & Tenders Portal
- Calls for proposals are published on the European Commission Funding and Tenders Portal
- Sign into the portal and find your host organisation (need the Participant Identification Code (PIC)
- Fill in the administrative forms (Part A) seek help from your host research supports
- Upload your completed Part B in PDF and submit before the deadline!



Evaluation Criteria

Tips on Writing a Proposal

How to succeed



More than simply a research project! Approach the fellowship as an opportunity to...

Gain new knowledge by working on your own research project

need a suitable host and supervisor(s)

<u>Learn new skills</u> for your future career:

- additional scientific skills
 - transferable skills

<u>Grow your networks</u> for future collaborations

... scientific networking + public engagement

<u>Disseminate</u> your results to expert audiences

<u>Exploit</u> your research for further use

<u>Communicate</u> your research among the general public

Engage in mobility and transfer of knowledge

- two-way knowledge transfer between researcher and host
 - interdisciplinary and intersectoral knowledge

Practical Tips

- Lead in time! You need to start early! Several months before the deadline.
 - > Be succinct! Get straight to the point. Focus on bold key points. Figures and schematics can be useful!
- Be clear on why your research is important!
 - Think about why the EU should fund this. What challenge are you trying to solve in the context of EU priorities (if applicable)?
- Early and frequent engagement with the supervisor and host organisation.
 - You will need information from them for certain parts of the proposal.
- Pay attention to the evaluation criteria.
 - Make a checklist and don't ignore any points!
- Use the call-specific proposal template available in the Submission System.
 - Use the correct year and version!
- Ask other people to read your proposal (both within and outside your area).
 - They should be able to follow what your proposal is all about.
 - Test your proposal with different audiences.

- International European interest organisations (e.g., CERN, EMBL)




Non-academic sector

 - E.g., large companies, SMEs, NGOs, museums, hospitals, international organisations


PF Candidate: How to Find a Host Institution









