# [FULL-FIGHT] UFC 309 Live Free Broadcast TV On 16 November 2024

UFC 309 goes down Saturday night with a heavyweight championship showdown atop the bill, and MMA Junkie Radio's "Gorgeous" George and "Goze" will host a live-streamed watch-along right here at 8 p.m. ET.

The UFC is headed to the Big Apple this weekend for UFC 309. The main event is a title fight between American Jon "Bones" Jones (27-1-0) defending his heavyweight championship belt against fellow American fighter Stipe "Stone Cold" Miocic (29-4-0).

The UFC is returning to New York's Madison Square Garden this weekend with UFC 309. At the top of the card is a heavyweight title defense by Jon Jones — arguably the pound-for-pound GOAT in UFC's history — against former two-time champion Stipe Miocic. We'll also see Charles Oliveira vs. Michael Chandler in a co-main fight, and Bo Nickal vs. Paul Craig in a middleweight clash.

Jones, 37, is the current heavyweight champion and a two-time former light heavyweight champion, while Miocic, 42, is a two-time former champion at this weight.

The title fight is supported by a strong undercard, which includes the lightweight rematch between Charles Oliveira and Michael Chandler. Follow live updates below.

How to Watch UFC 309: Jones vs. Miocic With ESPN+

The most straightforward way to watch UFC 309: Jones vs. Miocic is with ESPN+, which holds exclusive broadcasting rights for UFC in the U.S. You can access the event as an ESPN+ PPV for \$79.99, but an ESPN+ subscription is required to make the purchase.

UFC 309 is going down on Saturday, Nov. 16 with prelims at 8 p.m. ET/5 p.m. PT. The main card follows at 10 p.m. ET/7 p.m. PT.

UFC 309 live stream: how to watch Jones vs Miocic start time, odds, weigh-in results

Former champion Stipe Miocic looks to teach Jon Jones a thing or two when he challenges Jon Jones at UFC 309 for the UFC heavyweight title. The event takes place at Madison Square Garden and will air on ESPN+ PPV in the U.S.

Jones dominated the light heavyweight division for years as its champion, beating a who's who of killers. The only dent on his resume is outside the octagon, where he has been involved in numerous controversies. "Bones" beat Ciryl Gane to win the UFC heavyweight title in 2023, which was the last time he competed.

Miocic fights for the first time since 2021 when lineal heavyweight champion Francis Ngannou knocked him out. The 42-year-old had bided his time waiting to compete for gold again and plans to show the world that age is only a number.

Jones is new to the division, while Miocic helped guide it to prosperity. He believes his experience will trump Jones' inexperience within the division.

"Definitely a different ballgame when it comes to heavyweight," said Miocic via The New York Post. "We've got bigger guys who hit harder... a lot of things that are different. We'll see. I have some things up my sleeve, just like he does."

## What time is Jones vs Miocic?

The UFC 309: Jones vs Miocic main card is expected to start at 3am GMT / 10pm PT / 2pm AEDT on Saturday 16th / Sunday 17th November 2024 at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The Jones and Miocic cagewalks are expected at around 6am GMT / 1am ET / 5pm AEDT.

### UFC 309: Jones vs Miocic preview

The reigning heavyweight champion and greatest light heavyweight in UFC history, Jon Jones, takes on the greatest UFC heavyweight of all time, Stipe Miocic, in what promises to be one of the fights of a generation at UFC 309 at Madison Square Garden today.

It's a blockbuster that's been a long time in the making – and then a pectoral tear for Jones forced its postponement for another 12 months. It means former two-time heavyweight champion Miocic enters this bout at the age of 42, having last fought over three years and seven months ago. It was a Round 2 defeat at the hands of Francis Ngannou, though Miocic's Daniel Cormier trilogy highlighted his ability to bounce back.

Jones, meanwhile, would argue that having something to bounce back from marks you out as a loser. Widely considered the top pound-for-pound fighter UFC has ever seen, the 37-year-old dispatched of the great Ciryl Gane within seconds of his heavyweight debut a year and eight months ago, and he'd love to be the man to send Miocic into retirement.

The co-main event is a belter too, with Charles Oliveira and Michael Chandler set for a rematch of their UFC 262 encounter. On that occasion the Brazilian rode out Chandler's hyper-aggressive start and an early knockdown to score a Round 2 knockout and with it the lightweight belt. Chandler has lost on his previous two visits to the MSG.

MMA Fighting has a live stream watch party for Saturday's UFC 309 event, which takes place at Madison Square Garden in New York City. In the main event, UFC heavyweight champion Jon Jones defends his title for the first time against two-time champ Stipe Miocic.
