## LIVE: UFC 309 Fight Free MMA Broadcast TV Channel

Jon Jones makes the first defense of his heavyweight championship when he faces former champ Stipe Miocic in the main event of UFC 309 on Saturday in New York.

The main card at Madison Square Garden is on ESPN+ pay-per-view starting at 10 p.m. ET, with prelims on ESPNews, ESPN+, ESPN Deportes, Hulu and FX at 8 p.m. and early prelims on ESPN+ at 6 p.m.



Jones (27-1, 1 NC) will be fighting at heavyweight for only the second time, after winning the UFC belt with a quick submission of Ciryl Gane in March 2023.

Miocic (20-4) last fought in March 2021, losing his title to Francis Ngannou by second-round knockout.

What are the storylines behind the top fights at UFC 309? How are experts breaking them down? What do the fighters have to say? Here is the fight card, how to watch it and a collection of all of the UFC 309 essentials.

UFC 309 goes down Saturday night with a heavyweight championship showdown atop the bill, and before the fights get underway, Farah Hannoun will host a live-streamed preview show right here, which kicks off at 5 p.m. ET.

In the headliner, heavyweight champion Jon Jones (27-1 MMA, 21-1 UFC) puts his title on the line for the first time when he takes on former champ Stipe Miocic (20-4 MMA, 14-4 UFC) in a fight delayed by a year. In the co-feature, former lightweight champ Charles Oliveira (34-10 MMA, 22-10 UFC) takes on Michael Chandler (23-8 MMA, 2-3 UFC) after he was left at the altar by Conor McGregor.

UFC 309 takes place at Madison Square Garden in New York and streams on ESPN+ pay-per-view following prelims on ESPNews, ESPN+ and Hulu.

Years of patience will pay off for fight fans, as UFC heavyweight champion Jon Jones will finally face former champion Stipe Miocic at UFC 309.

The prelims, starting at 8 p.m. ET will air on ESPN+. You can subscribe to ESPN+ for \$11.99 on a monthly subscription and \$119.99 on an annual subscription. For a limited time, get 12 months of ESPN+ for the price of 9 with the purchase of an annual plan.

It will also be streamed on Fubo which carries ESPN News and offers a free trial. It is also available on Hulu which offers FX via the Disney bundle.

The prelims will see fan-favorite Jim Miller, 2-2 in his last four fights, facing Damon Jackson, 1-3 in his last four fights. Meanwhile, light heavyweights are in action when sixth-ranked Nikita Krylov, on a three-fight win streak, faces eleventh-ranked Azamat Murzakanov, 4-0 in the UFC.

On the early prelims, rising star Veronica Hardy (9-4-1), on a three-fight win streak, faces Eduarda Moura (10-1), who is 2-1 in the octagon.

UFC 309 will be at Madison Square Garden on November 16. The early prelims start at 6 p.m. ET, while the prelims are at 8 p.m. ET. The main card starts at 10 p.m. ET, and Jon Jones and Stipe Miocic should make their way to the octagon around 12:30 a.m. ET, depending on how long the undercard fights last.

Jones held the UFC light heavyweight title at various points between 2011 and 2020, with his reign disrupted due to legal issues and failed drug tests. "Bones" vacated the belt in 2020 and didn't compete for three years, returning in 2023 after Francis Ngannou left the organization.

In March 2022, he faced Ciryl Gane for the UFC heavyweight title, stopping him in the opening round to become a two-division champion.

Miocic won the UFC heavyweight title in 2016 and defended it four times. The 42-year-old traded wins and losses with Daniel Cormier for the belt from 2018 to 2020. Miocic last fought in March 2021, losing the belt against Ngannou.

The winner is expected to face interim UFC heavyweight champion Aspinall, who has been more active of the two if neither retires.
