EURAXESS Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC), the Latin American and Caribbean Network of National Contact Points (LAC NCP Network) and MSCA-NET are writing to bring your attention to a unique opportunity offered to Latin American and Caribbean institutions through the Marie Sklodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF) call.

With MSCA PF, institutions in LAC have the chance to attract visiting researchers to carry out fully funded postdoctoral research for one to two years in their laboratories in LAC.

Under the Global Fellowships modality (GF), Europe-based researchers apply together with a host institution in Europe, while the institution in LAC will be considered an associated partner and does not require co-funding.

To take advantage of this incoming mobility, we encourage you to familiarise yourself with the call and contact your partners in Europe. Additionally, to increase your institution's visibility, you can **express your interest** in receiving a future Global Fellow (PF/GF) by publishing a hosting offer on the EURAXESS portal (see how at http://bit.ly/HowtoPostHostingOffers).

The MSCA are part of the European Commission's Horizon Europe programme. They fund, among other things, the mobility of experienced researchers (with a doctorate degree), through their Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF). Among other activities, the team promotes and disseminates the European Commission's funding for mobility and cooperation under its funding programme Horizon Europe.

The Latin American and Caribbean Network of National Contact Points (LAC NCP Network) is integrated by all the National Contact Points (NCPs), officially designated by the science, technology and innovation competent body or chancelleries of each LAC state. It promotes and increases the participation of academy, companies and institutions in Horizon Europe in order to democratise access opportunities among the different countries of the LAC region.
