3 EURAXESS Members in Focus: LUXEMBOURG - heartland of Europe that embraces diversity

3.1 Meet LUXEMBOURG – an Inspiring Place!

Strategically located in the heart of Europe, the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg is a strategic smart business, **research and innovation location** with a national character of openness, dynamism, reliability. For centuries, the country has been at the heart of a multitude of cultural influences, partly because of its geography but also because of trade, industrialisation, and **immigration**. It has protected its woodlands, shaped its landscapes with winegrowing, farming, and architecture. It has cultivated linguistic diversity, cultural originality, and economic freedom. It was also considered for a long time that the prosperity of Luxembourg was due to the richness of its soil. Once one of the main steel plant sites of Europe, the country became a financial place over the years due to the steel crisis in the seventies, before morphing recently into a research and innovation hub. Today, Luxembourg is **one of the most attractive countries in the world for working and living**, and a genuine societal laboratory.

3.2 LUXEMBOURG Policy and Strategy

LUXEMBOURG IS A DYNAMIC COUNTRY, WHERE RESEARCH HAS BECOME A CENTRAL ISSUE

Public research in Luxembourg is young and dynamic with research policy contributing to the transition of the country towards a knowledge-based society. The overarching rationale behind research policy is to strengthen innovation as a driver of sustainable socioeconomic development and to contribute to a further diversification of the economy by developing new and strengthening existing high added-value economic activities. In this sense, research and innovation policy has been one of the major priorities of the Government since 1999 with Government budget outlays rising from 28 million euros in 2000 to approximately 400 million euros in 2016. This **proactive and committed policy approach puts Luxembourg firmly on the map of European research.** This is illustrated among others with the position of the University of Luxembourg, while only created in 2003, ranging 11th in the latest “Times Higher Education” ranking of the 200 Universities under 50 years.

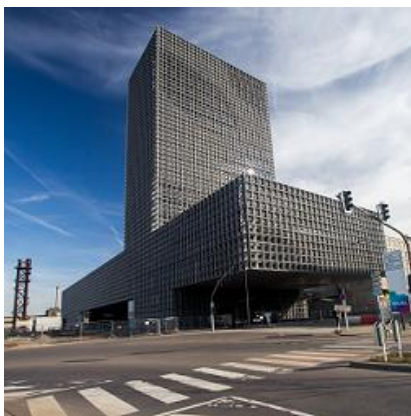

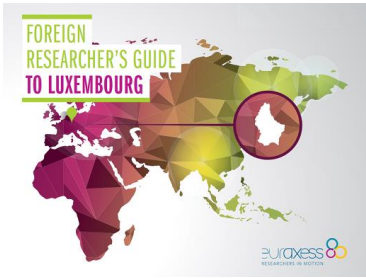
Private Sector Recruitment Opportunities

The Luxembourg National Research Fund (FNR) is the main funder of research activities in Luxembourg. The FNR invests public funds and private donations into research projects in various branches of science and the humanities, with an emphasis on selected core strategic areas. Furthermore, it supports and coordinates activities to strengthen the link between science and society and to raise awareness for research. The FNR also advises the Luxembourg government on research policy and strategy. The FNR has a broad range of international funding opportunities, among which bilateral collaborations with RIKEN in Japan or the NRF in Singapore. 3.7 Luxemburg-China Science Relations

3.7.1 Bilateral Agreement on ST&I Cooperation

Bilateral agreement for cultural cooperation has been in effect since 1979 between the People's Republic of China and the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg on co-operation in the fields of culture, arts, science, education and sports. The last five-year executive programme was signed in Beijing on 29 November 2005.

Under this agreement, several agreements have been signed between the University of Luxembourg and Beijing Renmin University, Shanghai Tongji University as well as Shandong University to provide for students' and researchers' exchanges.

3.7.2 Main initiatives and programmes available to Chinese researchers

Luxinnovation, the national agency for innovation and research assists in providing funding for research, development and innovation activities in Luxembourg. A wide range of financial aids is available to support R&D activities in both the public and the private sector.

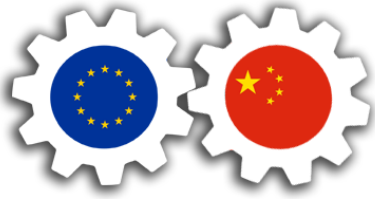
Academic cooperation schemes, not limited to China, are all coordinated by the National Research Fund (FNR) in Luxembourg.

INTER: the INTER Mobility Programme has been developed as a means to fund research stays abroad from Luxembourg researchers as well as visits to Luxembourg from foreign researchers (6 weeks to 1 year).

PEARL: With the PEARL programme, the FNR wishes to provide the institutions with a proactive means to attract internationally recognised senior researchers who will transfer and establish their research programme in Luxembourg in order to accelerate the development of and to strengthen the national research priorities.

ERCIM Grants (European Research Consortium in Informatics and Mathematics) are intended to attract young researchers of post-doctoral level from anywhere in the world to work on a research problem in informatics and mathematics at two research centres in the ERCIM network.

AFR: The 'Aides à la Formation-Recherche' (AFR) scheme provides grants for PhD and postdoctoral research training. The AFR programme has no thematic limitations and is open to all researchers, regardless of their nationality, desirous to engage into research training in Luxembourg or abroad. In the selection process, the interest of the project in the context of Luxembourg R&D will nevertheless be evaluated.

The EURAXESS Country Representative presented the different aspects of applying for individual fellowships followed by an hour-long discussion in both Chinese and English where Marie Curie Fellow Qin Xiangang shared his experience.

The meeting took place both online and offline. The group slides and recording was shared online in a dedicated Wechat group and members of the Marie Curie Alumni Association answered written questions from people who couldn't attend.
